Dear Mr. Bowin:

As you are aware, this office was notified of your possible violation(s) of the following section(s) of the Berkeley Campus Code of Student Conduct:

- V.102.04. Theft of, conversion of, destruction of, or damage to any property of the University, or any property of others while on University premises, or possession of any property when the student had knowledge or reasonably should have knowledge that it was stolen.
- V.102.06. Unauthorized entry to, possession of, receipt of, or use of any University services; equipment; resources; or properties, including the University's name, insignia, or seal.
- V.102.08. Physical abuse including but not limited to...and other physical assault; threats of violence; or other conduct that threatens the health or safety of any person. (See Berkeley Campus Student Policy and Procedures for further information.)
- V.102.14. Disorderly or lewd conduct.
- V.102.15. Participation in a disturbance of the peace or unlawful assembly. (See Berkeley Campus Regulations Implementing University Policies for further information).
- V.102.16. Failure to identify oneself to, or comply with the directions of, a University official or other public official acting in the performance of his or her duties while on University property or at official University functions; or resisting or obstructing such University or other public officials in the performance of the attempt to perform their duties.
- V.102.19. Possession, use, storage or manufacture of explosives, firebombs, or other destructive devices.
- V.102.25. Violation of any other University policy or campus regulation.

The allegation was on or about December 11, 2009 you participated in a disturbance at the University House in which students felt threatened for their safety. After a review of the available information in this matter,

Student Conduct has determined that there is insufficient evidence to make a determination of responsibility on your part. Accordingly, your case with this office has been dropped.
